Graduate Diploma in Occupational Safety & Health (GDipOSH)

The Graduate Diploma in Occupational Safety and Health at Massey University has been devised to provide people holding a first degree or other qualifications, including relevant work experience, with advanced knowledge and skills in the multidisciplinary area of occupational safety and health.

Why study Occupational Safety and Health?

Occupational safety and health has become an integral part of business in New Zealand over the past few years. It has been identified by the National Occupational Health and Safety Advisory Committee (NOHSAC) as a critical area in which there is a national deficiency in expertise. The occupational safety and health programme at Massey University is one of the few tertiary academic programmes in New Zealand that is designed to rectify this deficiency.

The GDipOSH programme is supported by Massey University's Centre for Ergonomics, Occupational Safety and Health (CErgOSH) which is an international leader in OSH and Ergonomics research, consultancy and delivery of short courses.

The programme has a structure which gives participants exposure to a variety of disciplinary approaches. It has strengths in a number of areas including occupational hygiene, hazard management, OHS management systems development, evaluation and ergonomics. The Diploma differs from other courses which might approach occupational safety and health from a social science or health perspective.

You don't necessarily need an undergraduate degree to study for this diploma.

If you are interested in studying for a university qualifications in OSH - a Graduate Diploma in OSH (GDipOSH) - you would normally need an undergraduate degree to gain entry to Massey University's 'GDipOSH' programme. However, you could be accepted on to the programme if you can show that you have practical industry experience which is considered 'equivalent' to a degree. Many GDipOSH graduands have entered the programme at Massey this way. Massey does not undervalue the importance of 'work experience or professional qualifications'. Indeed one of the papers in the GDipOSH is in fact a 'Project in OSH' and can be undertaken in your workplace. So without an existing degree but with relevant work experience, you can apply to Massey for 'Admission with Equivalent Status (AES)' to start the Graduate Diploma in Occupational Safety and Health (GDipOSH). A 2005 report by the NZ National Occupational Health and Safety Advisory Committee has advised the government that there is a clear need for qualified OSH and other similar specialists, so why not apply to study the Massey GDipOSH via AES!

The programme of study can be flexibly adjusted to suit your individual circumstances. Also, all of the Massey papers in the GDipOSH are offered in the extramural mode, which means you can study from home or, even better, ask your employer to give you some time to study. They might even pay some paper fees for you!

The GDipOSH is designed to be completed part-time over at least two years. If you take three years or less to complete, you would be eligible to have the degree awarded with distinction, should your grades allow. Some extramural papers have a 'practical hands-on' block contact module of 2-5 days. Some can be taken as 'internal' students.
