Postgraduate Diploma in Specialist Teaching (Autism Spectrum Disorder)

PROGRAMME STRUCTURE

Students enrolled in the programme will complete four compulsory papers. Each paper is worth 30 credits.

Year One:

254.765 Core Theory and Foundations of Specialist Teaching
249.745 Theory and Foundations of Autism Spectrum Disorder

Year Two:

249.749 Evidence-based Practice in Autism Spectrum Disorder
249.750 Practicum in Autism Spectrum Disorder

This programme is part of a wider qualification that includes six endorsements:

- Autism Spectrum Disorder
- Blind and Vision Impairment
- Deaf and Hearing Impairment
- Early Intervention
- Gifted and Talented
- Learning and Behaviour

The Postgraduate Diploma in Specialist Teaching adopts an inquiry-based interprofessional learning model. Interprofessional practice reflects the need for interaction, communication and collaboration across and within specialty disciplines. Participants in this course will be learning with, from, and about each other in an interdisciplinary community context.

AUTISM SPECTRUM DISORDER (ASD)

The Year One Specialist paper covers personal and theoretical perspectives of ASD; assessment for identification, diagnosis and educational planning; understanding and implementing interventions; understanding behaviour; and ASD across the life-span. In Year Two the evidence-based practice paper looks at interventions and working collaboratively in more depth while the practicum paper provides the opportunity to work with children with ASD.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry to the programme requires a relevant professional qualification and a New Zealand undergraduate degree or equivalent.

DELIVERY

This is a part-time distance qualification which includes face-to-face block courses and online course work.

WORKLOAD

The total amount of time for each paper is approximately 12.5 hours per week.

KEY STRENGTHS OF THE COURSE

- Highly practical using an inquiry-based approach.
- Flexible delivery including e-learning and face-to-face delivery making it easier to participate while still working.
- Generic core courses for all endorsement areas covering common knowledge and skills for specialist teachers to facilitate a shared understanding and collaborative approach.
- Interprofessional environment (study alongside other types of specialist teachers) to learn with, from and about each other within a broad community of practice.
