

Japanese Language Papers

- Japanese 1A (offered in Semester One)
- Japanese 1B (offered in Semester Two)
- Japanese 2A (offered in Semester One)
- Japanese 2B (offered in Semester Two)
- Japanese 3A (offered in Semester One)
- Japanese 3B (offered in Semester Two)

Prerequisites

- Pass Japanese **1A** → eligible to enrol in **1B**
- Pass Japanese **1B** → eligible to enrol in **2A**
- Pass Japanese **2A** → eligible to enrol in **2B**
- Pass Japanese **2B** → eligible to enrol in **3A**
- Pass Japanese **3A** → eligible to enrol in **3B**

Note: You can not enrol two Japanese language papers at the same level in the same semester , e.g. **1A** and **2A** or **2B** and **3B**.


