Focus

Agriculture and Horticulture

Level of Study

Postgraduate

Purpose

The Murray and Terry Scholarship supports agriculture and horticulture students in the first year of their master's programme, or a postgraduate diploma.

Background

This scholarship is supported by a combined fund from a gift from F. Terry of Ngongotaha in memory of his son, George Harold Terry, a graduate of Massey Agricultural College, who was killed in action in Italy in 1944; and from a bequest made from the will of Janet Murray of Auckland.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. In recent years this has been \$3,000.

The scholarship is usually awarded annually, and the tenure is for a single academic year.

At the discretion of the University all, or part, of the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the scholarship may not be granted each and every year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship is typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be enrolled full time in a master's degree or postgraduate diploma in disciplines relevant to agriculture or horticulture at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on:

- academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship

The selection panel may take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants in seeking an equitable distribution of funds.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation from the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

Payment will be made in May.
