

New to Massey University First Year Student Agriculture and Horticulture Scholarship

Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Agriculture and Horticulture

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The New to Massey University First Year Agriculture and Horticulture Scholarship supports first-year undergraduate students transitioning from high school to study in the fields of Agriculture or Horticulture Science.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. It is typically approximately \$7,000.

The scholarship is awarded annually, and the tenure is for a single academic year, available to full time first year (100 level) students only.

Typical Number on Offer

Typically, up to 40 scholarships will be awarded each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be intending to enrol full time in the first year of an undergraduate degree studying in either the Bachelor of Agricultural Science, the Bachelor of Horticultural Science, or the Bachelor of Horticultural and Plant Systems.
- be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident, or an international student who has completed their secondary schooling in New Zealand

Recipients must meet the admission criteria for the programme they intend to enrol in at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on academic merit in NCEA results Level 2 (or equivalent) and a personal statement on career and industry ambitions.

Selection Committee

The scholarship will be awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee, based on the recommendation of the College of Science Applied Academic Programme Scholarships Committee.

Conditions of the Scholarship

Payment will be made in two equal instalments upon confirmation of full-time enrolment in semesters one and two and following the University's official withdrawal date of these semesters.

Payment of the second instalment is contingent on awardees passing all enrolled courses in semester one.

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
