

Charles and Ella Elgar Bursaries

Bursary Regulations

Focus

Service men or women or the children or grandchildren of discharged service men or women

Level of Study

Undergraduate and Postgraduate

Background

These bursaries are provided from a Trust Fund established by the Will of the late Ella Grace Elgar who, with her husband Charles, farmed at "Fernside" near Featherston in the Wairarapa.

Value and Tenure

The value of each bursary shall be up to \$1,500. The bursary is tenable for one year.

Typical Number on Offer

Typically, up to three bursaries per academic year

Eligibility

Applicants must have been discharged following service in the New Zealand Defence Forces or be the children or grandchildren of such discharged service men and women. Preference will be given to applicants studying agriculture or a related science.

Selection Criteria

The selection criterion is academic merit and all-round achievement.

Selection Panel

The bursary is awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation of the Trustees of the Bursary.

Conditions of the Bursary

Recipients may re-apply in subsequent years.

The Trustees are presented with the top three applicants for final selection.
