Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Agribusiness

Level of Study Undergraduate

Purpose

The Ormond Meat Marketing Scholarship encourages students to undertake study that will prepare them for an agribusiness career within the meat industry.

Background

This scholarship is named after Sir John Ormond (1905 - 1995), a long-time chairman of the New Zealand Meat Producers Board.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined by the interest earned on the fund. In recent years the value has been approximately \$2,000.

The scholarship is offered annually as funds permit and is for a tenure of a single academic year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship is typically offered each year but may be awarded to more at the discretion of the selection panel.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- enrolled in an undergraduate degree in agriculture at Massey University in the year of application. This includes but is not limited to the Bachelor of Agribusiness, Bachelor of Agricultural Science, or Bachelor of AgriCommerce.
- studying full time.

Preference may be given to first year applicants.

Selection Criteria

The selection will be based on:

- academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship.

Preference will be given to applicants who can show within their application that they are sincere in following a career path into agribusiness and the meat industry.

The selection panel will also take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants in seeking an equitable distribution of fund

Selection Panel

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation of the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The University Scholarships Selection Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and its decision is final.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
