Focus

Agriculture and food, animal science and welfare, environmental science as it relates to biodiversity of farming.

Students from the Wairarapa district

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The Sydney Campbell Foundation New to Massey University First-Year Undergraduate Scholarship supports students from the Wairarapa district studying in the following areas:

- agriculture and food (including agriscience, agribusiness, food technology, horticulture and agritech)
- animal science and welfare
- environmental science as it relates to biodiversity of farming

Background

This scholarship is provided under the will of Mr Sydney Campbell, who owned the Wairarapa sheep and beef farm Riverside Farm. Mr Campbell died in 1977.

Value and Tenure

The annual value of the scholarship is typically up to \$2,500. The scholarship is tenable for a single academic year.

Typical Number on Offer

Three scholarships are typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be intending to enrol full time in the first year of an appropriate undergraduate degree at Massey University in the year following the award of the scholarship; and
- normally be domiciled in Wairarapa south of Woodville, and between the coast and the Tararua/Remutaka Ranges; and
- have attended secondary school in this district, or are normally domiciled in the district but attended secondary school outside of the district (e.g., boarding school)

Preference is given to applicants who are taking courses in agriculture or horticulture and show an inclination to return and live in Wairarapa upon completing their course.

All applicants need to meet the entry criteria for the programme that they intend to enrol in at Massey University

Selection Criteria

The selection criterion will be based on:

- NCEA results Level 2 (or equivalent)
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the Sydney Campbell Foundation Trustees.

Conditions of the Scholarship

Payment will be made in two equal instalments upon confirmation of full-time enrolment in semesters one and two and following the University's official withdrawal date of these semesters.

Payment of the second instalments contingent on awardees passing all enrolled course in semester one.

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

The Trustees have the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and their decision is final.
