Purpose

The Grace Kay Veterinary Scholarship financially supports New Zealand-born veterinary students

Background

This scholarship was established by the trustee of the estate of Grace Edith Meliora Kay in memory of Grace and her husband, Allan, who used to farm at Orakau, near Te Awamutu.

Value and Tenure

The annual value of the scholarship is typically \$2000 each but the number of scholarships awarded, and their associated value, will depend upon the funds available and the need of the recipient.

The scholarships are usually offered annually.

The scholarship may be awarded for one or more years but tenure of the scholarship will not exceed the minimum time required to complete the course and will also be dependent upon satisfactory academic progress towards the degree.

Typical Number on Offer

The number of awards is dependant on available funds.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- intend to work and reside in New Zealand
- have been born in New Zealand
- be in their second, third, fourth, or fifth year of study of a Bachelor of Veterinary Science at Massey University

Selection Criteria

The selection criteria are need as well as academic merit.

The University Scholarships Committee may take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicants in seeking an equitable distribution of funds.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Veterinary Programmes Scholarship Committee.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
