Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Earth and Environmental Science

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The scholarship supports students entering the Bachelor of Earth and Environmental Science at Massey University for the first time, who have a passion for understanding how we impact Earth's systems and how to use scientific skills to steer us towards a more sustainable future.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is up to \$5,000 for students enrolling in the Bachelor of Earth and Environmental Science.

The value will be prorated for part time students.

Typical Number on Offer

Multiple awards are available, dependant on available funds and suitable candidates.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- intending to enrol, full time or part time, in the Bachelor of Earth and Environmental Science
- a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident

Recipients must meet the admission criteria for the programme they intend to enrol in at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on academic merit to date and on the applicant's relevant experience and passion for this field as demonstrated in a personal statement.

Consideration of personal characteristics, including cultural identity, background, and experience, will be given to ensure that equity outcomes are achieved.

Selection Committee

The scholarship will be awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee, based on the recommendation of a panel consisting of academic staff within the School of Agriculture and Environment.

Conditions of the Scholarship

Payment will be made in two equal instalments upon confirmation of enrolment in semesters one and two and following the University's official withdrawal date of these semesters.

Payment of the second instalments contingent on awardees passing all enrolled course in semester one.

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.
