The Taranaki Veterinary Centre Scholarship supports Bachelor of Veterinary Science students who have an interest in Large Animal Production to see practice in their fourth and fifth year of study.

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is \$6,000, to be paid in two equal instalments. The tenure of the scholarship is two years.

Typical Number on Offer

Typically, one scholarship will be awarded annually.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents and normally reside in New Zealand
- enrolled full time in the fourth year a Bachelor of Veterinary Science at Massey University

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on:

- academic results from the previous 2 years of study
- a written statement on why the applicant wishes to pursue a career in large animal
- the applicants CV
- two reference letters

Shortlisted applicants may be invited to attend an interview.

Selection Committee

The scholarship will be awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation of the Taranaki Veterinary Centre.

Conditions of the Scholarship

It is expected that the successful candidate shall see practice with Taranaki Veterinary Centre for at least one week in their 4th year (calving time recommended) and at least one week in their 5th year (total of a minimum of two weeks over two years).

Receipt of the second year of the award is dependent on the recipient passing the fourth year of study.

This scholarship may be held concurrently with any other scholarship, bursary, or award, provided this is not considered to constitute a conflict of interest.
