HISTORY

The New Zealand University Blues Award is the highest sporting accolade given in the New Zealand tertiary sector. It is part of a tradition dating from 1922 in New Zealand, and earlier in England, where the colours of England's most famous universities, Oxford and Cambridge, came to be a symbol for sporting excellence.

Sporting 'Blues' became famous through the rivalry between Oxford and Cambridge. Oxford Blues were only awarded for 'real' sports, such as rowing, rugby and cricket. Athletes in other codes could only aspire to half Blues. One Irish university purportedly awards top athletes 'Pinks'.

Massey University's earliest recipient of a New Zealand University Blues Award was Mac Cooper in 1934. This was for rugby. Mac Cooper also won a Rhodes Scholarship in 1934 and played against the All Blacks in 1935 for Oxford and Scotland. George Robinson and Eric Orgias were awarded Blues in 1935 for athletics. Hockey player Hector Lawry also won a New Zealand Universities Blues Award in 1935.

In 1990, Massey University resurrected the practice of awarding Blues to its top sporting students with the Massey Blues Award. These

were awarded for all sports. A selection committee was created and a formal set of guidelines for potential recipients was established to ensure high standards and consistency across the codes.

The Blues trophies are presented to our on campus and distance top performing Sportsman and Sportswoman.

2018 saw the introduction of an additional award to allow recognition of student success across all aspects of high performance in sport. The Sporting Excellence Award celebrates the achievements of coaches, managers and officials who have performed at the same level however are not eligible for an individual athlete Blue.

The University values the Blues Awards and genuinely wishes to honour the individual achievers. Students nominated must excel in their chosen sport as well as their academic studies. A huge commitment and strict discipline is required of a Blues Award recipient, as students must successfully juggle the demands of academic study with heavy training and performance schedules.

2025 BLUES AWARDS RECIPIENTS

ARCHERY

Logan Dittert

Bachelor of Sport and Exercise

Logan was selected to represent New Zealand as a member of the 2025 Trans-Tasman team. He also qualified for the New Zealand team for the 2025 FISU World University Games but was unable to compete at the event. Choosing to compete in the Open Men's category rather than his age-grade, Logan placed 4th in both the Individual Open Men's Compound Division and the Compound Teams event at the 2025 National Championships.

Chisora Hada

Bachelor of Science

Chisora represented New Zealand in the 2024 World Archery Oceania Challenge, finishing 6th overall in Men's Open Recurve and as the top-ranked New Zealander. At the 2025 National Championships he gained a 2nd, 3rd, 4th and two 5th place finishes in Open Men's individual events. At the 2025 WAA Indoor Championships he placed 2nd in Men's Open Recurve, and at the 2025 WAA Clout Champs he was 1st in Open Men's Recurve. He placed 2nd in the Open Men's Recurve at both the 2025 WAA Field Champs and the WAA Indoor Championships.

ARTISTIC ROLLER SKATING

Claudia McLean

Bachelor of Accountancy

Claudia was selected to represent New Zealand at the 2025 World Skate Oceania Championships and the 2025 Pacific Cup for Senior Ladies Solo Dance and Senior Ladies Figures. She was also selected as a reserve for the 2025 Figure World Cup. She competed at the 2025 Taiwan Artistic Roller Skating International Open, placing 5th in Senior Ladies Solo Dance. At this year's New Zealand National Artistic Roller Skating Championships, she placed 6th in Senior Ladies Solo Dance and 4th in Senior Ladies Figures.

Phoenix Reid

Master of Science

Phoenix was selected to represent New Zealand at the 2025 Pacific Cup and the 2025 Figure World Cup. She represented New Zealand at the 2024 World Skate Games competing in Senior Ladies' Solo Dance, and the 2024 World Figure Cup in Senior Ladies' Figures. At the 2025 New Zealand National Artistic Roller Skating Championships she placed first in the Senior Ladies Figures, received the Jack Fanthorpe Memorial Fund award and was joint winner of the Avis Berry Trophy.

Bachelor of Accountancy

Ben represented New Zealand at the 2024 World Skate Games in Italy, placing 16th in Junior Men's Solo Dance. He was selected to represent New Zealand again at the 2025 World Skate Oceania Artistic Roller Skating Championships in Brisbane, the 2025 Figures World Cup in Argentina, and the 2025 World Championships in China. In early 2025 he competed at the Taiwan Artistic Roller Skating International Open and placed 1st in Junior Men's Solo Dance and 2nd in Junior Men's Free Skating. At this year's New Zealand National Artistic Roller Skating Championships he placed 1st

in Junior Men's Solo Dance, Junior Men's Free Skating, Junior Men's Figures, and Matanga Loops.

Jessica Shirley

Jessica was selected to represent New Zealand at the 2025 World Skate Oceania Championships in Senior Solo Dance. Earlier this year she competed at the Taiwan Artistic Roller Skating International Open where she placed 3rd in Senior Solo Dance with a personal best score of 79.13. At the 2025 New Zealand National Artistic Roller Skating Championships she finished 5th in Senior Solo Dance with a personal best Nationals score, and 7th in Senior Figures.

ATHLETICS

Olivia McTaggart

Bachelor of Sport and Exercise

Olivia won the 2025 London Diamond League event in London's Olympic Stadium in July with a lifetime best jump of 4.73m. This height was also the World Athletics Championships entry standard. Competing throughout Europe she had multiple podium finishes including placing 1st at the Meeting Stanislas Nancy event, and 2nd at the Spitzen Leichtathletik Luzern, the Meeting International Sotteville, and the The Keely Klassic in Birmingham. She also placed 3rd at the Parvo Nurmi Games in Finland. At the 2025 World Athletics Indoor Championships in China, she finished in 11th place, and at the 2025 NZ Track & Field Championships she finished 2nd.

Nick Palmer

Graduate Diploma in Arts

Nick represented New Zealand at the 2025 FISU World University Games, where he qualified for the shot put final and finished 4th overall. In July he won the shot put at the Sparkassen Cup in Germany, the Morton Games in Dublin, and the Cork City Sports event in Cork. He also placed 2nd at the 2025 New Zealand Track and Field Championships.
