Focus

History research

Level of Study

Postgraduate

Purpose

The purpose of this scholarship is to support postgraduate research in history.

Background

The Max Chapple Memorial Scholarship was established in memory of Max Honomai Chapple, who in 1995 completed a Bachelor of Arts with a major in history at Massey University

Value and Tenure

The value of the scholarship is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. The tenure is a single academic year

Typical Number on Offer

One or more awards are made annually

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- have recently completed a bachelor's degree
- be enrolled in a postgraduate course of study in history at Massey University
- be undertaking a research project of 60 or more credits in the year of application

Selection Criteria

The selection criteria are academic merit and financial need.

Preference may be given to applicants intending to undertake a research project in the fields of New Zealand or Pacific Islands history.

Selection Panel

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Committee on the recommendation of the Head of School of Humanities.

The University Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants and its decision is final

Conditions of the Scholarship

At the discretion of the University all, or part, of the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the scholarship may not be granted each and every year

Although the scholarship may be held concurrently with other scholarships or bursaries, the Head of School of Humanities will take such emoluments into account when assessing the overall needs of applicants.
