Focus

Agriculture and Horticulture

Level of Study

Postgraduate

Purpose

The Hudson and McGowan Scholarship supports postgraduate agriculture and horticulture students.

Background

The scholarship is support by a combined fund from endowments from the late H. W. Hudson of Auckland in appreciation for agricultural training received by his son William, and the late Edgar Augustus McGowan, an engineer from Auckland who wished to commemorate his father Daniel Joseph McGowan.

Value and Tenure

The value is determined each year from the interest earned on the capital. In recent years this has been \$4,500.

At the discretion of the University all, or part, of the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the scholarship may not be granted each and every year.

The scholarship is offered annually, and the tenure is for a single academic year.

Typical Number on Offer

One scholarship is typically offered each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

graduates of Massey University

• enrolled full time in a postgraduate degree or a postgraduate diploma in disciplines relevant to agriculture or horticulture at Massey University.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on:

- academic merit
- the benefit to the applicant and their study in receiving this scholarship, and how well the applicant meets the conditions and intentions of the scholarship

Other scholarships and bursaries may be taken into account in seeking an equitable distribution of funds.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded on the recommendation from the Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee, College of Sciences.

The Applied Academic Programmes Scholarships Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

Payment will be made in May.
