Purpose

To support students in their undergraduate study who are experiencing financial difficulty

Background

The funds for the Bootten Bequest Bursaries were endowed to Massey University from the estate of the late Mrs C Bootten, for the purpose to provide financial assistance to students to enable those students to complete the study for which they are enrolled. Mr and Mrs Bootten farmed for many years in Eltham, Taranaki

Value and Tenure

The value of each bursary will be up to \$5000 and will be paid in one instalment.

Typical Number on Offer

The number of awards vary and shall be determined each year from the interest earned on the capital.

Eligibility

Applicants must be:

- New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- enrolled at Massey University in a first undergraduate degree
- studying full time at Massey University's Albany, Manawatu or Wellington campus and/or online

Selection Criteria

Selection will be based on demonstrated genuine financial hardship, a record of academic success in any studies to date, and evidence of good character.

Selection Panel

The selection panel consists of the University Scholarships Committee or nominee.

Conditions of the Bursary

In recommending the award of a bursary the Selection Committee will take account of other scholarships and bursaries held by the applicant with a view to achieving a reasonable distribution of monies among qualifying candidates.

At the discretion of the University, the annual interest may be reinvested to maintain the value of the capital fund so the bursary may not be granted each and every year.
