AUCKLAND

MANAWATŪ



1 NAVIGATING ACADEMIC CREDITS


Students normally take four courses, each worth 15 credits, during a semester.


Impress your future employers

The Kāhui Irarau is a social hub connecting rainbow communities and provides initiatives and content created by and for rainbow communities and allies.


