Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Water quality and management

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The David Renouf Environmental Science Scholarship supports undergraduate students studying courses in water quality and management, soil science, land and water science, or ecology.

Value and Tenure

One scholarship to the value of \$3000 will be offered to be used towards tuition fees. A second scholarship to the value of \$2000 to be used towards tuition fees may be offered dependant on available funds and applicants.

A lesser value may be awarded to part time recipients at the panel's discretion.

Typical Number on Offer

Up to two scholarships will be awarded each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be New Zealand citizens or permanent residents
- be enrolled in either a Bachelor of Science majoring in Environmental Science or a Bachelor of Earth and Environmental Science majoring in land and water.

Preference may be given to students who have completed courses in water quality and soil health.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on the applicant's commitment to improving water quality in New Zealand as demonstrated in a statement, as well as the intention of the recipient to remain in New Zealand and apply their knowledge to the betterment of New Zealand. Academic merit achieved in the study to date may also be taken into consideration.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation of the Head of School, Agriculture and Environment.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

The University Scholarships Selection Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants.
