Scholarship Regulations

Focus

Water quality and management

Level of Study

Undergraduate

Purpose

The David Renouf Environmental Science Scholarship supports undergraduate students studying courses in water quality and management, soil science, land and water science, or ecology.

Value and Tenure

One scholarship to the value of \$3000 and a second scholarship to the value of \$2000 to be used towards tuition fees.

Typical Number on Offer

Up to two scholarships will be awarded each year.

Eligibility

Applicants must:

- be New Zealand citizens enrolled full time in a Bachelor of Science majoring in Environmental Science.
- have completed at least 120 credits towards their degree and be in their second or third year of full time study.

Preference will be given to students registered in the following courses: Land & Water Science, Applied Catchment Management, or Applied River Management.

Selection Criteria

The selection is based on academic merit in the programs and courses identified above and the applicant's commitment to improving water quality in New Zealand as demonstrated in a statement.

Selection Committee

The scholarship is awarded by the University Scholarships Selection Committee on the recommendation of the Head of School, Agriculture and Environment.

Conditions of the Scholarship

The scholarship may be held in conjunction with other scholarships, bursaries or awards, so long as those scholarships, bursaries or awards permit co-tenure.

The University Scholarships Selection Committee has the right to refrain from making an award if there are no suitable applicants
