#### SPORT MANAGEMENT

From 2019 onwards, The Bachelor of Sport Management will no longer be available to prospective students in Manawatū. It will be delivered from the Auckland Campus and via distance.



### COLLEGE OF HEALTH (COH)

#### CHANGES TO THE BACHELOR OF HEALTH SCIENCE:

Massey's Bachelor of Health Science is a health degree where you study both science and social sciences to prepare you for addressing the big health challenges facing the nation and world in the 21st century.

In 2019, there will be a new major available: Health Services Navigation (HSN)\*: to develop skills and understanding that can assist others in their navigation of the complexities of the health care system. Focuses on advocacy and leadership and the social and functional (as opposed to medical) implications of impairment, disability and disadvantage.

#### ABOUT THE OTHER MAJORS:

**Environmental Health (EH):** Protect people from threats to health from products, pollutants, or from our built and natural environments

**Health Promotion (HP):** Enable people and communities to take positive actions to improve their health and wellbeing

**Integrated Human Health (IHH):** Learn how the human body functions and how nutrition, exercise, sleep, genetics and the environment affect our health

**Occupational Health and Safety (OHS):** Improve the effects of the working environment on the health of workers by eliminating and reducing hazards and risks and creating healthy workplaces

**Psychology (Psy):** Make sense of people and their motivations and explore the psychological aspects of health and the relationship between mental and physical health

## COLLEGE OF HEALTH (COH)

### NEW MAJORS IN THE BACHELOR OF SPORT AND EXERCISE:

A new Major will be introduced to this programme. Students may now choose to take Sport Development as a major under the Bachelor of Sport and Exercise. Sport development is a multifaceted, and often holistic, concept that plays an important role in the initiation, support and promotion of sport and physical activity at the volunteer, club, regional and national organisational levels, from grassroots to the elite level. This major will prepare students for work in the varied and growing area of sport development by providing knowledge in topics such as sport organisational structure and function, event and facility management, sport communication along with sociological, conditioning and business issues linked to sport and the athlete.

The major previously known as Exercise Prescription and Training will now be referred to as Exercise prescription.

In terms of the content within this major, there are no changes.

Lastly, there will be no offerings for The Bachelor of Sport and Exercise in Wellington from 2019 onwards, it will be offered from Palmerston North and via distance.

# BACHELOR OF COMMERCIAL MUSIC



## THE NEW SOUND ENGINEERING PATHWAY

The School of Music and Creative Media Production is excited to announce a new pathway in Sound Engineering in the Bachelor of Commercial Music programme.

Alongside existing majors in Music Practice, Music Technology and Music Industry, the Sound Engineering pathway allows students the option to diversify their Music Technology major, and will equip students to be able to operate a professional quality recording studio, recording and mixing everything from a solo artist to a full band, or engineer and light a live gig. A wide range of subject areas are covered, including recording, mixing, acoustic theory, effects, processing in both live and studio environments.

We're looking for the next generation of sound engineers – students who are passionate about recording, production, live sound, studios, electronic music tools and working with other great artists. And they don't have to play an instrument - the studio is their instrument!

### Studio facilities and staff

Students in the Commercial Music programme have access to world class studio facilities and technology labs and learn from some of New Zealand's top sound engineers and music technology specialists, all of whom have esteemed New Zealand and international careers. Our staff bring many years of invaluable experience to the school and our students.

Sound Engineering lecturer Neil Aldridge spent 15 years in the music industry based largely in London as a recording and mix engineer on hit records. In 2005, he moved into the film industry as a dialogue editor and ADR recordist. His film credits include King Kong, The Lovely Bones, District 9, The Chronicles of Narnia: The Voyage of the Dawn Treader, The Adventures of Tintin, and the Hobbit trilogy.

The School is also lucky to have other veteran staff from Park Road, TV3, and Sky Sport covering outside broadcast, music and technical supervision.

### Major Project Development in Commercial Music

With the first Commercial Music programme students midway through their third year, the breadth of major projects is exciting. Students have developed their own projects and are collaborating within and across the three majors. By the end of the year there will be performances, tours and festivals, new software platforms, business models and new hardware instruments, to name but a few. Amongst these projects there is an emphasis on industry engagement and career development beyond the degree.

# BACHELOR OF CREATIVE MEDIA PRODUCTION (CMP)

## NEW CMP DIRECTING AND PRODUCING PATHWAY

The CMP programme has also been growing and from next year we will be offering a new pathway in Directing and Producing.

The Directing and Producing pathway enables the next generation of creative leaders in the screen industry. Engaging in production development, pipeline design, cast, crew and team management, directing and producing students will learn the tools to bring a project to a successful completion.

Through practical and critical engagement, students will gain a creative and technical knowledge and understanding of approaches and methodologies essential for producing and directing film, television, animation, visual effects, games, augmented reality and other emerging media.

The students were invited by Bula Batiki, a village initiative producing sustainable, hand-made coconut oil, facilitated by The Earth Care Agency. The island is actively demonstrating the opportunity for Fijians to become sustainable within their own communities after the damage Cyclone Winston recently wreaked on the island.

With the ideation and pre-production completed in the first semester, the 3rd year teams will ramp up to full production this coming semester. As part of the vertically-streamed student progression, our year 2 students will be joining the year 3 projects as team members. This integration across years allows for the year 2 students to experience what a Major Project is, and for the year 3 students to engage with team management and production handling.

The 3rd year Major Projects will all be presented at the 2018 Exposure show in November.

### New AR/VR lab

Our investment in new technologies will be visible in the coming months with the launch of our new mixed realities lab set up for both faculty research and student learning in the areas of virtual, augmented and mixed realities. VFX and New Technologies lecturer Taylor Carrasco will be leading the charge on this – he comes to us from the mixed reality company Mixt (where he was Chief Technology Officer) and was formerly at Weta Digital for a number of years.

### Major Project Development in CMP

The CMP year 3 students are in full swing on their year-long major projects. Working with external industry stakeholders, the students form into teams to tackle large-scale productions across multiple media. Some of the current projects include a video game installation for Te Papa, show pilots for TVNZ's new children's platform Heihei, and a documentary on climate change for the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade.
