

 Why did you choose this particular university and/or country for exchange?

I was very interested in going to Japan and this option offered the greatest financial support as well as great language exchange opportunities.

- What courses did you study while on exchange? Would you recommend them?
   Media Studies, Business, Culture, Tourism, History, Pop Culture, Japanese Grammar, Kanji, Calligraphy. I would recommend the Japanese language papers.
- Were there differences in the teaching methods and academic environment at your host university, compared to Massey University? If so, what kind of differences?
   The difference was that instead of doing 4 in-depth papers per semester we did anywhere between 7 – 13 smaller papers. The testing usually consisted of weekly homework and quarterly tests.
- Did you stay on-campus or off-campus? What was the accommodation like? My accommodation 'Proxy' was a 10-minute walk from campus. It was nice in terms of facilities e.g. shower, toilet. The only complaint would be that it was in front of an intersection which meant it was loud a lot of the time, also the kitchen was quite small (as expected though).
- How did living expenses compare to in New Zealand?
   I believe that accommodation, food, public transport and food were much cheaper than in New Zealand.
- What extra-curricular activities did you participate in at the host university?

  There were many excursions offered through the university of which I attended many.

 What's one thing you learnt about your host country or culture?

In japan however, peoples focus is often towards the better of society or family, often leaving one's own ambitions to the side if it means bettering everyone around you.

I loved the food, the architecture, the fashion, the culture and the history and the atmosphere. A highlight would be traveling with a friend to Kamikochi and experiencing the most scenically beautiful places I have ever visited.
