



The campus is across the harbour from central Auckland, 15km away, and is spread across three sites:


- > East Precinct, off the Albany Expressway

FINDING A NEW HOME

As a new student, there are a variety of accommodation options available depending on what you're looking for:

- > Halls of residence and apartments – live right on campus and meet new people from all over the world in either a self-catered apartment or hall of residence.
- > Homestay – immerse yourself in the cultural experience of living with a local family in their home.
- > Independent rental and share house accommodation.

Please note: accommodation for under-18 international students is limited to a homestay option. Living with a relative or family friend will need to be approved as a homestay provider with proof of age, residency, and police checks. There will be extra charges for the under-18 checks.

COST OF LIVING

In terms of living costs, Auckland compares favourably against other major cities including London, Sydney, Melbourne, Hong Kong, Singapore and New York.

Before granting a student visa, Immigration New Zealand will require you to show you can support yourself for the first year.

As an international student, New Zealand law also states you need to have medical and travel insurance. The easiest option is to buy insurance through StudentSafe which we'll offer to you when you pay your fees.

Your Pathway Options

MUC is your alternative pathway to starting your degree at Massey University. Here are the study options we offer to help you bridge the gap:

FOUNDATION PATHWAY

For those who don't quite meet the academic requirements for admission, the Foundation Certificate (International) course has been designed to help you transition straight into the first-year of a selection of undergraduate degrees at Massey University.

The programme will prepare you for undergraduate study, by increasing your English and academic skills, knowledge and capabilities. During the course you'll gain various general academic skills, such as effective verbal and written communication, as well as subject-specific knowledge relating to your chosen degree pathway.

The course is available in a one-year standard mode, or a 1 Trimester accelerated version.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE PATHWAY

MUC offers two English language pathway programmes: General English and English for Academic Purposes.

Delivered by highly qualified and experienced English language teachers in a small-class setting, our General English course is designed to improve your core skills in reading, writing, listening and speaking. Students will graduate with the ability to communicate in English with confidence in everyday situations and feel prepared to take on further academic study in New Zealand.

Our English for Academic Purposes course will provide you with an IELTS-free pathway if you meet the academic, but not English language requirements for entry into Massey University. It focuses on the various reading, listening, study skills and strategies necessary for success in academic contexts. It will also help to develop your vocabulary and grammar, particularly key academic skills of discussion and presentation.

MUC offers a flexible teaching structure that is tailored to your future study choices. If you plan to study a Foundation Certificate (International), then you'll complete our English for Academic Purposes 1 (EAP1) course, with an entry of IELTS 5.0 overall. If you are preparing to enter university directly, you'll complete English for Academic Purposes 2 (EAP2), with an entry of IELTS 5.5 overall.

Sign and return the written acceptance of your offer to Massey University College Admissions Office together with evidence of payment for the amount specified in your “Offer of Place”. Once we have received your payment we will send you a “Receipt of Payment”.

International students may then apply for a student visa to study in New Zealand. You will need to provide both your “Offer of Place” and “Receipt of Payment” documents when applying for a visa. Explore your visa options and lodge your application via Immigration New Zealand.
