WHAT IS POSTGRADUATE STUDY?

HE AHA TE AKO
PAERUA?

Postgraduate study enables you to take your career to the next level, through in-depth study in a particular area of interest. It helps you take your prior experience and knowledge, and use your initiative as you research, and contribute to your field of expertise. It requires planning, dedication and will take time away from your everyday life, but ultimately your hard work could open the door to new opportunities and greater responsibility.

HOW DOES IT DIFFER FROM UNDERGRADUATE STUDY?

During your undergraduate study, you will have learned many of the skills required to study successfully at postgraduate level. However, it is important to realise that postgraduate study requires greater independence, and you'll need to use your own initiative in completing course work and undertaking research projects.

You'll generally be expected to have some knowledge and prior experience in your subject area, however postgraduate study can also be used to support a career transition. As an example, a person with a science PhD may contemplate an MBA. You'll be supported and encouraged by your supervisors in a range of ways, but in many circumstances, you'll be in the driving seat when it comes to getting work done.

Postgraduate study is more strongly focused on theory and research in the discipline, and many postgraduate qualifications have a research component. You'll also be expected to possess a higher level of critical thinking and analysis, show that you read extensively, and can develop your own views, and defend them.

ARE YOU READY FOR POSTGRADUATE STUDY?

Postgraduate study requires time, commitment, and a range of skills beyond those you may have needed as an undergraduate. We have provided a series of online tools and resources to help you think about the different aspects of studying at a distance, and to assess your abilities, time commitments and motivations for study. FINDING TIME FOR STUDY

Studying at university requires a significant time investment. Students often comment that balancing their everyday commitments with study requirements can be challenging. It is important to carefully consider how many courses you should take, especially when beginning your study. You should be realistic about the number of courses you can take in a semester and consider all your existing commitments. You will need to spend approximately 24 to 24 hours each week for a 30-credit single semester course, or about 10 to 12 hours per week for a 30-credit double semester course.

PATHWAYS TO POSTGRADUATE STUDY

Most postgraduate students enter their study already possessing a bachelor's degree. However, if you want to change the direction or focus of your study, you may need to begin with a graduate diploma. Masters' degrees can be one- or two-year programmes, depending on your entry route. They can be mainly coursework, a combination of coursework and a research project or thesis, or a thesis only. Doctoral degrees are awarded entirely for research reported in your thesis (PhD) or for a combination of coursework and a thesis (the 'Named' doctorates).

TYPES OF PROGRAMMES AVAILABLE

HONOURS DEGREE

Honours degrees are postgraduate qualifications comprising an additional year of study beyond the bachelor's degree in the discipline. Entry to an Honours degree requires prior high academic performance in undergraduate degree study. Students selected for an Honours degree will enrol in the postgraduate degree after completing the undergraduate degree. Completing an Honours degree may qualify you for doctoral study if your achievement is high enough.

MASTER'S DEGREE

A master's programme allows you to undertake advanced study – usually on the main subject in your qualifying undergraduate degree. Some Master's programmes allow you to move into a different discipline from your undergraduate study.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA

A postgraduate diploma builds on your prior academic achievement, and generally takes one year of full-time study to complete. It can lead to further study at Master's or Doctorate level.

DOCTORATE (PHD)

The Doctor of Philosophy (PhD) degree is the qualification to kick-start your research career. It is the highest degree Massey offers regularly. It can be acquired in most of the disciplines, including the creative arts. It may involve external supervisors from a CRI, or other research institute. It is Massey's most supervised, fully research-based degree.

A PhD is awarded for a thesis, which is an integrated and coherent report demonstrating your ability to carry out independent research and analysis at an advanced level in a particular field. Your thesis should make an original contribution to knowledge of the subject it focuses upon.

It will be assessed by three independent examiners in a process that includes thesis assessment reports and an oral examination. It normally takes at least three years of full-time study to complete a PhD. If you'd prefer to study part-time, you need to allow five to six years to complete the research and writing.

NAMED DOCTORATES

Massey University offers two named doctoral degrees:

- > Doctor of Clinical Psychology (DClinPsych)
- > Doctor of Social Work (DSW)

These are specially-designed degrees involving high-level study and research. They are ideal professional development options for existing and prospective senior managers and leaders.

Named doctorates basically comprise one-third course work/practicum and two-thirds supervised research. In all other respects – including the examination procedure – they're equivalent to a PhD, especially in the standards of discipline, rigour and scholarship required.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Entry requirements for each programme vary, so it's best to talk to the team at Massey University to find out what level of postgraduate study is right for you.

REPUTATION AND RANKINGS

Each year more than 20% of Massey University's student population study at postgraduate level, including 1000 Doctoral (PhD) degree students. Massey University has an international reputation for its research innovation, practices and results, which are applied to postgraduate programmes of study. The University also has strong international links across the globe, with accreditation and endorsements across a number of programmes. Massey University's teaching and research departments are divided into five colleges:

THE SUPPORT YOU NEED

We want to help you succeed in your postgraduate studies. Massey offers student services and workshops designed to give students assistance where it's needed. Our student services can assist you with accommodation, health, counselling, recreation, childcare, and other personal services, while our workshops and seminars will help you develop the academic and research skills needed to excel in your studies.

FLEXIBILITY

We offer three locations for on-campus study, in Auckland, Palmerston North and Wellington. We also have an extensive distance learning (extramural) programme, so you can choose where and when you want to study instead of being forced into regular lectures and timetables. Nearly half of all our students study via distance learning, with about a fifth of them being postgraduate students.

■ JESSICA PAWLEY Master of Arts, New Zealand Author

Her e-books for teens have already attracted more than one million readers. She has huge international and New Zealand fan bases. Now Massey University Master of Arts (MA) graduate Jessica Pawley has signed off international screen adaptation rights for her just-published science fiction novel 'Air Born'.

Published as J L Pawley, she was picked up by award-winning New Zealand publisher Steam Press in 2016, and Air Born was launched in Auckland and hit New Zealand bookstores in October 2017. The Russian and Chinese translation rights have also been sold – huge markets for the young writer who graduated with a first class Master of Arts in 2017. Air Born is the first novel of her young adult sci-fi series Generation Icarus, an earlier version which she self-published through an e-book streaming app. Through this platform, she cultivated a strong relationship with her fan base. The feedback from readers contributed to the evolution of the series, and their love for the books led to the enthusiastic creation of fan art, fan fiction, and social media accounts.

The story centres on a group of diverse teenagers – including a Māori main character, who unexpectedly grow wings – and are forced to band together for survival as they are caught between extremists of both science and religion. It has had excellent public and critical feedback and, less than two months after launch, Steam Press are already preparing for a second print run.

An avid reader since childhood, Jessica's long-held dream was to write full-time. She says being driven, determined and disciplined helped achieve international success. She even researched the physics and biology of animal flight to create a believable sense of being a winged creature. Currently immersed in meetings with film producers and busy working to tight deadlines on television project development as well as honing her next book in the series, she says, "It's still very surreal." And real: "I've got so much work to do!"

WHY DID YOU CHOOSE TO STUDY AT MASSEY UNIVERSITY?

As a former student, I was already familiar with Massey's academic quality and structure. Administration and support was very smooth, friendly, and helpful. Most significantly, the extramural availability is excellent. This was the option that fit in the best with my existing life commitments.

WHAT WAS THE BEST PART ABOUT YOUR EXPERIENCE?

Seeing my own growth and improvement not just in my own writing skills, but also in my appreciation for others' craft, from teaching how to write essays to appreciating poetry. Daring to present my own interpretation and having it not only accepted but praised by my teachers, and the encouragement to pursue professional academic publication was exceedingly validating. The thrill of discovering new aspects of our language and culture that no one else had studied in the same way before was a little addictive!



HOW DID IT HELP YOU SUCCEED IN BUILDING A CAREER AS A WRITER?

I chose to do a MA because I could take creative writing courses, but I could also study other aspects of English such as the teaching of academic (essay) writing, and examining NZ fiction and poetry alongside well-known international works. I felt this widened my future opportunities rather than narrowed my expertise. I was also able to focus my academic research on a developing aspect of English that is highly relevant to my own career; online reading platforms, and the social media and digital community structures that develop within and around the e-books, including my own. Understanding how my readers relate to each other and the books helps me contribute much more effectively as a provider of content, which in turn benefits my career.

WHAT'S YOUR TOP ADVICE TO SOMEONE WHO MAY BE CONSIDERING TAKING THIS PROGRAMME?

Remember that it will be much more work than you think it will be. Be humble, but don't be afraid to stick up for yourself and your well-informed, evidence-based opinion.

HeiHei Health Centre, Christchurch
After 29 years of nursing in primary and secondary care, Marie-Lyne Bournival knew she was capable of achieving much more. So she completed her Master of Nursing at Massey University in 2015. That led her to her role as a nurse practitioner (NP) intern at Wigram Health, an integrated family health centre in Christchurch, serving 10,000 patients. In 2016, she obtained her NP registration. Today while she works as a nurse practitioner, establishing her own patient base, she also leads a team of 20 as the General Manager.



"The MN is critical to advance your career. I chose Massey for its extensive choice of courses and the support I got from the word go! All my lecturers were amazingly engaged, wanting us to succeed. To achieve a balanced life working four days a week and running a house with three teenagers, I focused on one course at a time. Massey is ahead of the game – academic and clinical expertise, library and IT support, and supportive lecturers. Being the Number One nursing school for research in New Zealand meant my lecturers were at the forefront of research, teaching and leadership. I met fantastic nurses from all over the country who are now lifelong friends."

"As an NP, I work collaboratively with medical, administrative and nursing teams to deliver the best care for our patients. We've established a unique model of care including daily huddles, rooming patients, advanced and independent nurse clinics, triage and treatment of acute presentations. It has been clearly recognised that the nursing team is crucial to high quality care and a thriving business.

As a result, we have now two nurses on the NP pathway. Both chose to attend Massey University. We have also established a junior nurse role where a new graduate can gently and safely learn practice nursing. These are all part of strategies to implement a career pathway for primary health care nurses whether it's clinical (nurse prescriber, nurse practitioner) or management (policy and procedures, business ventures). All this is thanks to my MN which allowed me to consolidate new knowledge, both clinical and leadership.

Without a doubt, Massey was the best decision for my career and for improving the outcomes of our patients. It's my mission to make primary healthcare nursing a career pathway."

■ NICK SNEDDON

Post-doctoral Fellow in Dairy Systems,
Institute of Veterinary, Animal and
Biomedical Sciences; PhD in Animal
Breeding and Genetics, Graduated 2016
Forest View High School, Tokoroa

I became interested in genetics at high school. Coming from a dairy farming family, animal breeding was able to combine both interests.

Massey gave me the opportunity to study with some of the best dairy cattle geneticists in the world, and use the university's links with international

researchers and institutes. It has been an enjoyable challenge, with new techniques and areas of knowledge to learn.

I had two-and-a-half months studying at Moorepark dairy research centre in Ireland during the second year of my PhD. This gave me the opportunity to see another country and work with internationally-renowned researchers.

My PhD topic was "A Genetic and Economic Evaluation of Lactose in the New Zealand Dairy Industry". I estimated the heritability of lactose in the New Zealand dairy industry, and the effect of including lactose into the dairy breeding objective. I found that including lactose could save the industry \$60 million a year. In 2016, I presented more results from my research at the joint New Zealand Society of Animal Production/Australian Society of Animal Production conference in Adelaide.

Working with my supervisors was a great experience. I have continued to work with them on different projects now that I have completed my degree.

Since graduating, I have worked on projects with several national organisations and have made new connections with researchers both nationally and internationally. I hope to stay within research in the dairy industry – either continuing here at Massey or with a national industry body such as DairyNZ or LIC.



TAHUA NGORE SCHOLARSHIPS

MASSEY MASTERATE SCHOLARSHIP

Masterate Scholarships are offered for the purpose of encouraging postgraduate research at Massey University. Applicants must be enrolled or eligible to enrol full-time in a 120-credit research programme towards a master's degree at Massey University.

MASSEY DOCTORAL SCHOLARSHIP

Massey University Doctoral Scholarships are offered to encourage full-time doctoral studies at Massey University. They are open to domestic and international students. Applicants require an excellent academic record and must be enrolled or eligible to enrol in a 120-credit doctoral research course. The Vice Chancellor's Doctoral Scholarships are awarded on academic ranking in October each year to the top domestic doctoral recipients who start their scholarship within the funding year.

The Massey Doctoral scholarships are offered through the Colleges. Please see the regulations for the individual college you wish to study with. Currently Creative Arts, Health, Humanities and Social Sciences, and Sciences have specific information for interested students.

INTERNATIONAL POSTGRADUATES

NEW ZEALAND INTERNATIONAL DOCTORAL RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS (NZIDRS)

New Zealand International Doctoral Research Scholarships provide financial support for postgraduate students seeking doctoral degrees by research in New Zealand universities. Up to 10 scholarships are awarded annually. These scholarships are funded by the New Zealand Government and administered by the Education New Zealand Trust.

NEW ZEALAND DEVELOPMENT SCHOLARSHIPS

New Zealand Development Scholarships are available to candidates from the following countries: Bolivia, Ecuador, Honduras, Kenya, Mongolia, Nepal, Nicaragua, South Africa, Tanzania, and Zambia. Candidates independently apply for scholarships that covers tuition, return airfare,

medical and travel insurance and a living allowance. Applicants must have an offer of place before the application deadline, or the application will not be considered. Download the application form or visit the New Zealand Aid Programme website: mfat.govt.nz

The New Zealand ASEAN Scholars Award provides postgraduate scholarships for applicants from Cambodia, Indonesia, the Philippines, Lao PDR, Myanmar and Vietnam. Selection criteria are determined by partner governments. Applicants must apply for the scholarship via their home country. Scholarships cover tuition, return airfare, medical and travel insurance and a living allowance. Funding is no longer available for dependants. Candidates from Myanmar need to directly apply to the institution. Download the application form or visit the New Zealand Aid Programme website: mfat.govt.nz

COMMONWEALTH SCHOLARSHIPS

These are offered to students from other parts of the Commonwealth under the Commonwealth Scholarship and Fellowship Plan. The scholarships aim to provide opportunities for students to pursue advanced courses or undertake research at a university in New Zealand. Candidates are required to be Commonwealth citizens or British protected persons and must have graduated from an institution in their own country.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE AWARDS FOR PHD STUDENTS FROM THAILAND, VIETNAM OR INDONESIA

Massey University offers English Language education awards, covering tuition fees for up to six months per student, to selected students from Thailand, Vietnam and Indonesia who have been offered a place in a PhD research degree at Massey University.

HIGHER EDUCATION COMMISSION SCHOLARSHIPS

These are offered by Pakistan's Higher Education Commission (HEC) for Pakistani students seeking to pursue PhD degrees at Massey University.

E NGĀ – ĀKONGA MĀORI

Piki mai, kake mai, nau mai, haere mai ki Te Kunenga ki Pūrehuroa. Our name – Te Kunenga ki Pūrehuroa – ‘from inception to infinity’ encompasses Massey University’s vision of life long learning. We’re proud many Māori students continue their educational journey with us from their first degree to PhD level. We have many opportunities for Māori postgraduate study including postgraduate diplomas and masters’ degrees in Māori Visual Arts, Te Reo Māori, Māori Education, Te Aho Paerewa; Post Graduate Diploma Māori Medium Teaching, Health Science and Māori Resource and Environmental Management. We also offer a wide range of courses with a Māori focus, such as Māori Value Systems in Science, Treaty of Waitangi and Māori Responses to Colonisation, and Māori Management. There are staff on every campus with specific responsibilities for promoting Māori student advancement and excellence. These include librarians, student advisers and student counsellors. Māori teaching staff are keen to ensure Māori students are well prepared to contribute to Māori advancement.

MASSEY UNIVERSITY MASTERATE SCHOLARSHIP FOR MĀORI STUDENTS

Massey offers Masterate Scholarships for Māori students to encourage postgraduate research at Massey University. Applicants must be enrolled or eligible to enrol full-time in a 120-credit research programme towards a master’s degree. We also offer Te Pūtahi-Pūrehuroa Postgraduate Scholarships to support academic excellence at postgraduate level.

In addition, marketing and advertising, media and digital communications developed through operational, managerial and strategic roles and responsibilities across a multitude of industries.


The MBA was an opportunity to upskill whilst challenging myself. While I was very happy with my career achievements, I felt there was more to learn and gain, so I enrolled in Massey University's Executive MBA. PAEARU WHAKAURU **ADMISSION**

Postgraduate programmes include honours and masters' degrees as well as postgraduate diplomas and certificates. Graduate programmes include graduate diplomas and certificates.

Students applying for admission to a doctoral programme should refer to the Graduate Research School web pages for admission procedures. See grs.massey.ac.nz for more information.

Recognised entrance qualifications for graduate and postgraduate programmes differ by programme and you should refer to the admission requirements for your programme of choice on the Programmes and Courses website at study.massey.ac.nz.

Generally, postgraduate programmes require students to hold one or more of the following:

- > A relevant Massey University degree with above-average achievement as measured by grade average
- > A relevant degree from another New Zealand tertiary institution with above-average achievement as measured by grade average
- > A relevant degree from a recognised tertiary institution offshore with above-average achievement as measured by grade average
- > Relevant practical, professional or scholarly experience equivalent to that of a graduate. Not all graduate and postgraduate qualifications permit entry on this basis.

Entrance to graduate and postgraduate study is usually programme and major-specific, and may have conditions attached. Applications require at least 15 working days to process. You should apply well before the start of the semester in which you intend to study.

Verified transcripts from all of your previous tertiary study are essential unless you completed your previous degree at Massey University.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

All students studying at Massey University are expected to be able to write grammatically correct English, read English actively and with understanding, listen to and discern key points in spoken English and speak English freely and clearly. Procedures also exist for those students who wish to submit written work or examinations in Māori.

All international students whose first language is not English will be required to provide satisfactory evidence of their English language proficiency in the form of an academic IELTS or TOEFL score. More information is available on the International students web pages:

TOHU KAIRANGI MASSEY DOCTORATES

The doctoral degree is the highest degree awarded at Massey. The degree constitutes a significant piece of research in the form of a thesis or exegesis of up to 100,000 words or a series of publications that make a substantive and original contribution to knowledge. At Massey the research must be defended before a panel of experts and takes three to four years maximum to complete for a full-time student. The professional doctorates also include course work and in some cases internships/practicums.



Admission to the Master of Dairy Science and Technology requires you have been awarded or qualified for either a Bachelor of Engineering with Honours, Bachelor of Science with Honours, a Bachelor of Food Technology with Honours, or equivalent, and have approved employment in the New Zealand dairy industry to facilitate the requirements of courses 141.750 Dairy Products Research Projects and 141.848 Dairy Science and Technology Research Project.

DESIGN

BACHELOR OF DESIGN WITH HONOURS ✓

MAJORS INCLUDE: Fashion Design; Industrial Design; Photography; Spatial Design; Textile Design; Visual Communication Design.

The first year explores design practice and its core concepts, methods and applications through hands-on projects. You’ll be introduced to a range of disciplines and the generic principles of design through investigation, concept development and design experimentation. In the following years you’ll have the opportunity to mix, discuss and collaborate with other students across art, design, music and digital media production. You can tailor your expertise through a range of electives that support your selected major and help define your graduate pathway. In your fourth year you can choose whether to follow the research-based BDes (Hons) or project-based BDes programme: whichever pathway you choose you will push the boundaries of design innovation, consolidate your skills and extend the quality of your final project. Massey’s College of Creative Arts is ranked number one for design concept in Asia Pacific by international Red Dot Awards, and the only Australasian university to be awarded substantial equivalency by the prestigious US National Association of Schools of Art and Design.

MASTER OF DESIGN



The Master of Design (MDes) is an advanced research qualification in design. There is a 120-credit thesis-only option if you already have a four-year honours degree, and a 180-credit option if you have a three-year bachelor's degree. The 180-credit MDes starts with 60 credits of design courses, then the 120-credit thesis. Many projects have direct application to industry. You will complete a supervised programme of focused design research taking a challenging real-world design problem through to a well-resolved solution, such as a product prototype. The MDes gives you a lot of freedom. You have regular meetings with your supervisors, and critique sessions with your fellow MDes students, but you are in control of structuring your own time. You generally have two supervisors who are experienced designers in fields related to your research. It is their job to challenge you to take the project as far as you can. For your thesis, you have 12 months to focus on a single design research project, so you get to 'master' your project brief and deliver a well researched and resolved solution. To make optimum use of this time frame it works best when you enter the year with a clear project brief and develop strong relationships with your external 'client' from early on. External connections are really important in MDes projects. We expect you to keep in regular contact with your external partners or community of interest. Some projects even require you to be located in a business or production company for long periods. You have access to studio space alongside other design and art postgraduate students so there's a real sense of community, and of course all of our state-of-the-art facilities are available to you. MDes students can start their study in late February, mid-June or mid-September, depending on their own circumstances and arrangements with their external clients. The research topic needs to be carefully defined, and have strong industry links. Intending applicants should discuss their potential topic with the Postgraduate Coordinator – Design before development of their written outline. Application deadlines are: mid-November (February start); mid-May (June start); mid-August (September start). In 2018, the 180-credit MDes starts in September only. MFA IN DESIGN AND MFA IN FINE ART



The design/art MFA is the College of Creative Arts' premier postgraduate qualification for practising designers and artists. The MFA emphasises the production of original creative work that is research-driven, critically engaged, expertly realised and highly innovative. Massey offers two ways to do the MFA:

- > Full-time: on campus in Wellington, including postgraduate studio space on site. This takes two years.
- > Low residency: come to Wellington for four intensive one-week blocks per year, with mentoring and supervision in your creative practice by distance. This will take three to four years. The blocks coincide with school holidays. The MFA starts with the "Grad Camp" intensive block in the last week of January. Application deadline for all MFA candidates: November 15 (January start). The Postgraduate Certificate in Educational and Developmental Psychology is a bridging qualification leading to professional training in Educational and Developmental Psychology. This qualification is open to students who have been awarded a Master's degree in Education, Psychology, Counselling, Social Work, Speech and Language Therapy, or a related relevant discipline. The qualification will also be of significant value to students with a Master's degree in Educational Psychology (or equivalent) from other universities. This qualification provides an introduction to professional-level frameworks for practice as an Educational and Developmental Psychologist. The focus is on development of assessment skills and understanding of professional issues as they relate to professional practice in educational and developmental psychology. NOTE: Successful completion of the Postgraduate Certificate in Educational and Developmental Psychology will not give automatic entry into the Postgraduate Diploma in Educational and Developmental Psychology. Students are required to go through the selection process for the Postgraduate Diploma in Educational and Developmental Psychology and be offered a place. Massey's selected-entry post-masterate Postgraduate Diploma in Educational and Developmental Psychology is your pathway to becoming an educational psychologist. The one-year full-time internship provides a framework for supervised professional practice. Successful completion of the course will deem you eligible for registration as an educational psychologist with the New Zealand Psychologists' Board.

Within the course, an emphasis is placed on the use of effective problem solving approaches drawing on and integrating Māori and Western psychological, developmental, and educational theory and research. With a strong bicultural teaching pedagogy, which embeds Mātauranga Māori, as well as the ability to complete your internship in a variety of places including in schools, DHBs, with the Ministry of Education or youth justice, you'll develop strong foundations as an educational psychologist in Aotearoa NZ. MASTER OF EDUCATIONAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY ✓✓✓

The Master of Educational and Developmental Psychology builds the capacity of educators in formal, non-formal and informal learning contexts to be inclusive, adaptable and meet the needs of learners. This professional practice qualification encourages a greater depth of understanding about the factors that support or hinder learning in bicultural and multicultural contexts at both individual and system levels.

Whether you want to develop your current knowledge and skills as a teacher, educational leader or educational psychologist, steer into educational and developmental psychology research as part of a PhD, or follow the professional career pathway into the Postgraduate Diploma in Educational and Developmental Psychology Internship, the Master of Educational and Developmental Psychology creates multiple pathways for your future aspirations. It sets you up to work with and support learners to ensure equity in education and to create systems that enable learning. If you are already working, or your research experience is limited, this qualification will give you the knowledge you need to take your career to the next level or pursue more in-depth postgraduate research.

While you will gain a thorough knowledge of the fundamental principles of engineering, the MEngSt emphasises the application of your engineering knowledge to complex real-world industrial problems. You'll be able to tap into Massey's strong relationships with industry to find projects of relevance to you.

The degree will help you gain expertise in an area outside of the focus of your undergraduate qualification, or current employment, or help you progress your career in your area of interest. You can choose from a number of endorsements.

You'll learn the practical skills needed to undertake independent research in the food industry. You will then undertake your own large independent research project that focuses on real food industry problems and solutions.

At Massey you'll have access to real equipment to do research that's applied and practical to the food industry including: Pilot plant equipment, labs equipped to analyse and characterise food texture, rheology, physical properties, chemical composition and microbial flora; a facility to gather consumer data for the sensory properties of food, a post-harvest lab to study the packaging, storage and preservation of fruits and vegetables. Massey has research expertise in meat and fish technology, dairy technology, fruit and vegetables, carbohydrates, food additives and ingredients.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN INDUSTRIAL/ORGANISATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY

The Postgraduate Diploma in Industrial/Organisational Psychology (PGDipIOPsych) is an internship programme which provides a professional qualification for I/O psychologists. You'll do a supervised practicum and gain extensive knowledge of professional issues in the practice of I/O psychology. On graduating, you can apply for registration as a psychologist in New Zealand with the New Zealand Psychologists Board under the Health Practitioners' Competence Assurance (HPCA) Act. Industrial/organisational psychology (or work psychology) is a vibrant and dynamic field of psychological practice with good job opportunities worldwide. This programme considers both business and community issues. I/O psychologists can serve in a variety of roles and organisations, including not-for-profits, generating financial and/or social capital. As social critics, many work psychologists serve the interests of staff as much as those of employers.

NOTE: Applications must be with the School of Psychology no later than 1 October of the preceding year. No late applications will be accepted.

INFORMATION SCIENCES

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN INFORMATION SCIENCES

ENDORSEMENTS INCLUDE: Computer Science; Information Technology; Software Engineering.

The Postgraduate Diploma in Information Sciences (PGDiplnSc) is a taught programme, able to be completed in one year full-time.

NOTE: Suitable for international students requiring NZ study visa.

IMPORTANT: International students must select 'no endorsement'. An endorsement can be added after one semester if the student fulfils the requirement for an endorsement.

MASTER OF INFORMATION SCIENCES

SUBJECTS INCLUDE: Computer Science; Information Technology; Software Engineering.

In the Master of Information Sciences (MInfSc) you will learn how to apply problem-solving and analytical thinking skills to the analysis of, and solutions to, general software-based problems within the broader ICT community. You will gain skills in evaluating policies and processes used in the design, construction, testing and maintenance of advanced technological solutions in order to make informed strategic decisions. This is a taught programme, with a major component an in-depth professional project.

If you study full-time you can complete the MInfSc in three semesters (one and half years). The MInfSc gives you the option to focus and major in computer science (including topics such as artificial intelligence and graphics) or information technology (including topics such as mobile systems and security). Or you have the freedom to graduate without a major and mix and match the topics that interest you the most. Topics you can study include:

- > Artificial intelligence, computer graphics, computer vision, parallel and distributed computing, operating systems, rapid application development, data science and user interface design.

A professional practice project is an important part of this master's degree. You may have the opportunity to be involved in real projects for real companies on real issues that they wish to solve. This experience can lead directly to roles and add substantial value to your résumé when you are seeking employment.

You can also complete a MInfSc (by thesis only). This is a 120-credit research qualification for those who have completed the BlnfSc(Hons) or PGDiplnSc.

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

POSTGRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Graduates of the Postgraduate Certificate in International Development will be able to apply their knowledge and skills to developing policy and strategies and to managing and evaluating international development programmes. They will evaluate contemporary international development theories, policies and approaches and draw out relevant implications from research.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

As a Postgraduate Diploma in International Development student you will improve your understanding of how global forces shape the world, and hone the skills you need to help overcome poverty and enhance human wellbeing. You'll extend your abilities to analyse international development issues, collect relevant data, and write persuasively about development issues. Graduates will be able to apply their knowledge and skills to developing policy and strategies and to managing and evaluating international development programmes. Your PGDiplntDev is also a pathway to advanced research at master's degree level.

POSTGRADUATE DIPLOMA IN JOURNALISM

The Massey journalism programme enjoys a close working relationship with the country's leading newspapers, news websites, radio and television stations. Wellington's Dominion Post newspaper, for instance, has hired many of our graduates, hosts our students on work experience and funds prizes for our top students.

Massey's lecturers are experienced journalists, teachers and researchers. The standard journalism textbook used at all New Zealand journalism schools is produced by Massey staff. All of Massey's journalism staff contributed to the book.

The Massey University course is the only journalism school in New Zealand or Australia accredited by leading US agency ACEJMC. This confirms that Massey offers top-rated, internationally-recognised and endorsed journalism qualifications. The Postgraduate Diploma in Journalism is the qualification you need to become a journalist. It is a one-year full-time course, blending the theory with practical, relevant skills. It is based on leading overseas journalism qualifications and will build a firm foundation for your exciting career in print and web journalism, broadcasting and other media-related areas. Effectively all the graduates of the programme obtain jobs.

Work experience is a key component of the qualification, giving you relevant experience sought after by employers. In the second half of the year, you will spend time working at a media organisation, which can include newspapers, magazines, radio and television stations, or web-based news organisations. You will then do a full-time work placement at a media organisation.

This could be anywhere in the country, including major daily newspapers, magazines, internet news organisations, radio and television stations.

At Massey University, you will learn the vital industry skills you need to be a successful journalist in our modern society. The focus of the course is on news reporting. This is the basic skill that all journalism workplaces expect of their new recruits. From this core skill flows all the specialist skills, such as web-based reporting, feature writing, sports reporting, plus radio and television reporting, which are all taught on the course.

You will gain skills in news writing, feature writing, interviewing, photography, radio and television reporting, web-based journalism, media law, media ethics and shorthand. You'll gain industry experience through several weeks' work placement at media organisations.

Upon completion, you may choose to continue with a six-month in-depth project to complete a Master of Journalism qualification.

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There are two options for your study, depending on your level of experience. Both qualifications take 18 months full-time.

Pathway 1: If you have an undergraduate degree and wish to enter the journalism industry, you will learn the vital industry skills to be a successful journalist in our modern society. Your first two semesters (one year full-time study) will be equivalent to Massey's Postgraduate Diploma in Journalism. The remaining semester (six months full-time) is an extended, in-depth piece of journalism suitable for publication, with an additional academic component.

Pathway 2: The Master of Journalism offers another option for those who have journalism experience (three or more years) as well as an undergraduate degree. Toiho ki Āpiti (Māori Visual Arts programme), welcomes all indigenous and Pākehā artists by encouraging engagement in research and applied practices relevant to individual cultural contexts. 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International Office for essential information about visa applications and other processes. In the PGDipMVA, you will balance independent creative work in the studio with learning in Māori studies or museum studies, although art-making will be what you spend most of your time doing.

Students who have more than 10 years of exhibition practice can apply to undertake a studio-only postgraduate diploma; just talk to us about your situation.

The Māori Visual Arts programme embraces customary practices from carving to weaving to kowhaiwhai, and also fosters work that does not necessarily adhere to visual indicators of 'Māori' art. The work produced at Toiho ki Āpiti, especially at postgraduate level, often asks critical questions about identity and visual culture and exists at the interface of 'western' and 'indigenous' art.

Students can study on campus, with studio space provided, or by distance. Full-time and part-time options are available, so you can fit study around work and whanau commitments.

MASTER OF MĀORI VISUAL ARTS

The Master of Māori Visual Arts (MMVA) is a postgraduate research qualification. Many of New Zealand's most respected Māori artists have completed their Master's with Toiho ki Āpiti, while more recent graduates are attracting recognition as emerging talent. The programme welcomes all indigenous and Pākehā artists by encouraging engagement in research and applied practices relevant to individual cultural contexts.

As a MMVA student, you will spend most of your time conceiving and making art, in a kaupapa Māori environment. Students pursue an individually designed programme of advanced studio practice in Māori or indigenous visual culture related to who they are (whakapapa) as well as their personal strengths and interests. The objective is to realise an individually conceived body of work that allows for the design and/or coordination of an exhibition. The programme's strength lies in its flexibility and responsiveness. You can study a broad range of media and ideas, in a way that fits with your other work or whanau commitments.

Most students initially enrol in a Postgraduate Diploma in Māori Visual Arts, and transfer to the Master's programme for the second year if they achieve the required standard (B grade or above). Students spend most of their time in studio, although they can choose to include courses from Māori studies or museum studies. This is an advanced research qualification, so even students who choose to do a studio-only Master's degree will study Māori research methodologies and submit a written exhibition report.

It can be a stepping-stone to the Postgraduate Diploma in Nursing or a Master of Nursing, or preparation for advanced practice roles and/or Nurse Practitioner registration.

The Registered Nurse prescribing pathway is approved by the Nursing Council and meets the education requirements for authorisation with the Council as a designated prescriber.

Most nurses undertaking postgraduate study are in clinical practice, and study part-time. Postgraduate courses in Nursing are delivered in 'block mode' with face-to-face teaching in on-campus blocks, web-based teaching, relevant readings and other study material.

The MN prepares you for other senior roles, including clinical nurse educator or a clinical nurse specialist. You'll study a mix of theoretical and clinical courses, and learn from academics and professional clinicians who are highly experienced registered nurses.

The Postgraduate Diploma of Public Health (PGDipPH) is the first 120 credits (one year full-time) of the 240-credit Master of Public Health. It is designed to develop the core public health competencies recognised internationally as essential for advanced public health practice.

The PGDipPH will give you leading-edge expertise in many different subjects such as epidemiology and biostatistics, Māori and Pacific health, health economics, occupational health, environmental health, programme evaluation, health inequalities and health policy. Massey's PGDipPH emphasises applied research and practical experience. You will be able to apply knowledge gained through coursework to projects that reflect your work and interests. You will understand the core functions of public health: health promotion, disease prevention, disease surveillance and monitoring, health assessment and health protection. You will also be able to identify and critically analyse public health problems and solutions from a range of perspectives including biological, environmental, behavioural, social and cultural determinants as well as from a systems perspective. These skills will be invaluable in the workplace.

You can study in a way that best suits you: block or distance courses, full-time or part-time. Study can be tailored specifically for your needs. Graduates of the PGDipPH can do further study for a Master of Public Health. Many of our graduates successfully achieve an academic career in teaching and research.

MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH

The Master of Public Health (MPH) is a 240-credit (two years, full-time) programme that develops specialised public health and leadership competencies. You'll gain a critical awareness of the public health research literature, reason and act independently in your professional life, and undertake collaborative research within interdisciplinary and inter-sectoral environments. Specialisation opportunities now include public health nutrition, occupational health and safety, ergonomics, health promotion, and maternal and child health. Students in the MPH complete a work-integrated public health practical internship equivalent to one semester full-time, often negotiated within their existing workplace. You will learn to reason and act independently as a professional working in public health. You will be able to contribute to policy development at local and national levels, and to public health knowledge through scholarly inquiry and publication. You will also be able to apply your cutting-edge knowledge to solving public health challenges.

Options for the MPH include taking electives matching your interests, or a more research-focused route where students can elect to undertake a significant (90 credit) public health research dissertation project relevant to your public health work, interests and experiences and supervised by our team of public health researchers.

MAppISW students should read and note the 'fit and proper' requirements on the Social Workers Registration Board website. All MAppISW students will be vetted by the New Zealand Police (and/or equivalent overseas jurisdiction). A police record may not be a barrier to field placement, but full disclosure of any convictions in New Zealand and/or overseas is essential. All students will be required to meet screening in relation to the Vulnerable Children's Act requirements. All students must have a current full driving licence valid in New Zealand by the start of their field placements.

MASTER OF SOCIAL WORK

Excellent social workers are always striving to gain new knowledge. The Master of Social Work (MSW) is the right programme for you if you already have a professional qualification in social work and want to improve your practice. The MSW programme is intended for practitioners who wish to undertake advanced study of a specific aspect of social and community work. The MSW is flexible and offers you opportunities for both full and part-time study.

The MSW is a thesis-based programme that encourages social workers to pursue research in a particular field of practice, population, or area of interest. It equips social workers to develop and use research skills in their practice settings and keep current with the very latest theories and practice. Practice-based social work research can include needs assessments, programme development, implementation assessment and programme evaluation. It also includes theory development in a New Zealand context.

DOCTOR OF SOCIAL WORK

Massey's Doctor of Social Work (DSW) is the first social work doctorate offered in New Zealand, and is recognised internationally. It consists of a combination of course work or courses and a 65,000-word research thesis. A Doctor of Philosophy or PhD is achieved solely through a research thesis of 100,000 words. You can be confident you are delivering state-of-the-art solutions.

The DSW is offered both full-time and part-time so you can fit study in with your other commitments. Students can expect to study four years full-time, or up to six years part-time. Class work will take up to two years, before beginning your thesis.

These include epidemiology, parasitology, conservation medicine, physiology, ruminant livestock feeding, dairy, sheep, beef, deer or poultry production, animal welfare science and much more.

This degree is 180 credits, which means you can complete this degree in 1.5 years full-time. You can choose two different levels of research for this degree. You can complete a 60-credit research report, or – if you would like to complete more in-depth research – you can work on a 120-credit thesis to complete the research component of this degree. The remainder of this qualification is taught.
