PREFACE FROM THE DIRECTOR OF SUSTAINABILITY

Kia ora koutou katoa

Massey University has a strong record of teaching, research and engagement around sustainability-related matters. We are in the early stages of a process to reduce our carbon footprint as an organisation. But we can do more. Part of our challenge as a university is to decide where and how we can make a difference, and what our priorities should be. My appointment as Director of Sustainability was designed to help shape an institutional vision of sustainability to give direction and drive for Massey to engage in this space. It is too easy to feel weary, and even wary, of what has come to be placed in the sometimes baggy concept of sustainability. However, the impacts we are already seeing from climate change provide an urgent impetus for us as a university to show leadership in our academic endeavours and the environmental stewardship of our campuses and business processes. As a university with a strong focus on agriculture we have a responsibility to work hard on finding solutions that work productively across the social, cultural, economic and environmental domains.

I invite you to contribute to a process of clarifying Massey's vision, mission, values and high level goals in relation to environmental sustainability. Any ideas and views that you want to share about Massey's aspirations in this area and how you can contribute to that work are welcome. Your knowledge and expertise is important to help create a sustainability strategy that reflects the diversity and expertise we have in the university. I will be working with the Sustainability Advisory Group to draw together submissions from staff and students so we can produce a five year Sustainability Strategic Plan to provide the overall framework for improving and extending Massey's work on sustainability. I look forward to hearing your ideas.
